### Sugarwell Hill ('pop-up' gig / p-w-y-f)

Sugarwell Hill are a Leeds based three-piece old-time string band, featuring Simon Robinson (vocals, banjo, guitar, dulcimer), Evan Davies (vocals, mandolin, guitar, fiddle) and Michael Russell (fiddle, banjo, guitar). They play hypnotic, foot stomping fiddle tunes and sing folk songs and ballads from America and Britain.

Kaminari UK taiko drummers bring you an energetic and dynamic drumming performance. Originating in Japan, taiko combines rhythm and movement to produce a visual, fun and absorbing display. Formed in 2009, the band have grown into an established performance group playing a mixture of traditional Japanese pieces and original compositions.
